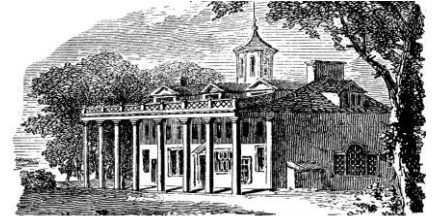

MVC MVC MOAA Legislative Corner

Virginia's most significant recent veterans legislation is the Safeguarding American Veteran Empowerment (SAVE) Act (SB 315/HB 398), which takes effect on July 1. This law protects nearly one million veterans from predatory, unaccredited benefit-assistance companies by capping fees, prohibiting upfront/non-refundable charges, and mandating transparent written disclosures.

The Commonwealth's ongoing legislative actions include key proposals for expanding tax relief, education waivers, and procurement policies. Important measures include:

- **Military Tax Subtraction (HB 137):** Legislation to incrementally expand the state income tax subtraction for military benefits, reaching a full subtraction by 2030. Another bill (SB 148) seeks to expand military tax subtractions for additional uniformed services.
- **Tuition Waivers (SB 92):** An adjustment to the Virginia Military Survivors and Dependents Education Program (VMSDEP), proposing to ease domicile and physical presence requirements for military families who relocate by lawful orders.
- **Veterans Business Procurement (SB 263):** A measure requiring public bodies to annually award at least 1% of their contract dollars to service-disabled veteran-owned and veteran-owned businesses, updating the state procurement portal by late 2026.
- **Benefits Protection Act (HB 1268):** Ongoing legislation to further define and restrict prohibited practices regarding paid-for consulting on veterans' benefits matters, currently continued for further study into 2027.
- **Statewide Strategic Planning (HB 1018):** A measure to convene working groups to establish a comprehensive statewide strategic plan for veteran-specific legislation and budget decisions.
